APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Those interested in participating in the I PPGAq Twitter Conference 2020 should register through this site from August, 5th till September, 09th, via Google Forms. The participant must access the PPGAq website and on the event tab, fill out the registration form correctly, which is **free of charge**.

Tweet your scientific work in digital format as a poster, in english, with a title, the hashtag #PPGAqPoster and other relevant hashtags as subject and so, as suggested below.

- Chemistry/Science Education - #PPGAqEdu
- Analytical Chemistry - #PPGAqAnaChem
- Inorganic Chemistry - #PPGAqInorChem
- Multiscience - #PPGAqMultiSci
- Organic Chemistry - #OrgChem
- Physical-Chemistry - #PPGAqPChem
- Electrochemistry - #PPGAqElectroChem

One may include other hashtags which feel suited to draw attention to the work presented

Certificate of participation will be given to those registered in #PPGAq2020.

- Images: photos, drawings or any type of art that appears in the abstract and/or poster must have source and permission for publication. The non-fulfillment of this item, the authors will be infringing the law 9.610/88 of Copyright.

Tips for a good poster presentation

1. The size / format for your #PPGAqPoster, the important thing is that the text and pictures are clear for people to read and understand. Using Microsoft PowerPoint, we found that a text size between 12 and 16 was easy to read when saving an A4 slide as a JPEG and when uploading on Twitter. Using an A0 template, the text needed to be between 50 and 60 to be readable. You can use any software you want to create your poster, as long as the image you send is clear for other people to read. We recommend testing your poster on Twitter before the conference to ensure you are satisfied with your image. 2. To maximize the accessibility of your #PPGAqPoster

There are several features available to increase the accessibility of your #PPGAqPoster to different user groups! Below are some suggestions and links to resources:

- When you tweet images, you have the option to write a description of the images so that the content is accessible to people with visual impairments. See <https://help.twitter.com/en/using-twitter/picture-descriptions> - for more information on how to do that. - The descriptions of the images have a character limit, so we suggest including the title in this image description and putting more details or explanations about the poster content as a topic in the comments.
- If you want to test the accessibility of your #PPGAqPoster to people with different types of color blindness, this site offers a color [blindness simulator](#).
- Uploading a link to a PDF of your poster along with your image may allow the use of screen readers for the visually impaired.
- We encourage you to place capital letters in hashtags, use simple language and explain any acronyms, to help increase accessibility to non-native English speakers of different or non-scientific origin.

NOTE: The official language of the event will be English. Thus, posters submitted to the event must be written in it.

Period of the event

The event begins on September 10, 2020 and ends on September 15, 2020.
